HOW TO RECEIVE AN OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

To secure credit for a PADI course at a college or university, you need an official transcript as proof of course completion. Colleges and universities will not accept certification cards or wall certificates as proof of course completion.

Note: Some institutions may not accept PADI courses for credit. Please contact your college or university before applying for credit to see if credit is accepted at the institution.

Your official transcript will come from Credly, the world's leading provider of digital credentials including digital badges and official transcripts to students. You may receive digital badges from Credly for each PADI course you complete. Credly badges can be shared on social media, added to your online resumes, and included on job recruitment sites.

To receive your digital badges and an official transcript from Credly, email this transcript request form to college.credit@ padi.com. After your certifications are verified, your information will be uploaded to Credly. You'll receive an email from Credly inviting you to claim your digital badge(s). A link in the email takes you to the Credly website where you create a free account to claim your digital badge(s). Once logged into your Credly account, you can send official transcripts at no charge by providing the name and contact details of the college to which you wish to send the transcript.

RECEIVE COLLEGE CREDIT FOR PADI DIVER TRAINING COURSES

The American Council on Education (ACE) recommends college credit for certain PADI scuba diver courses. ACE represents all colleges and universities before the US federal government and as such is the unified voice of higher education. ACE evaluates educational courses according to established college-level criteria and recommends college credit for those that measure up to these standards.

The ACE credit recommendations for PADI courses may help you in receiving college credit at an America university or college – even if the courses aren't conducted on a university or college campus. Courses offered through PADI Dive Centers, Resorts and at other locations qualify.

A university or college may use the ACE credit recommendations in a variety of ways. The institution may apply the credit to your major, replacing a required course. They may also use the credit as a general elective to possibly waive a prerequisite course.

Universities and colleges that accept ACE credit recommendations for PADI courses typically handle them like transfer credit. Transfer credit is often awarded without an additional fee. This may save you tuition fees while at the same time allowing you to possibly meet graduation requirements.

HOW MUCH COLLEGE CREDIT CAN I EARN?

The credit recommendations listed below apply to courses taken between 1 July 2024 and 30 June 2027. If your course was taken before 1 July 2024, different ACE credit recommendations may apply.
